Oklahoma's Youth Forestry & Wildlife Camp is a week-long adventure where students learn about and gain an appreciation for the natural world. By experiencing nature in a fun atmosphere, students will gain a life-long awareness and respect for the world in which they live. Camp is June 8-13, 2009, and will be offered at Group Camp 2 in Beavers Bend State Park, located in the heart of the Kiamichi Mountains north of Broken Bow. The group camp features air-conditioned bunkhouses, a dining hall, hot showers, basketball & volleyball courts, and an open air amphitheater.



While enjoying the out-of-doors, campers will explore natural resources and the issues affecting these resources through a series of hands-on programs led by resource professionals. These programs include wildlife management, forest management, stream ecology, fire management, urban forestry, and multiple resource management.

Of course, there is time for swimming, hiking, fishing, canoeing, and other outdoor recreation while making new friends from across the state of Oklahoma.
